

THE NEED

Climate change adaptation knowledge gaps pose significant barriers to successful adaptation actions. The Lima Adaptation Knowledge Initiative (LAKI) addresses knowledge barriers that impede the implementation and scaling up of adaptation action in developing country regions. The LAKI is a collaborative effort between the secretariat of the United Nations Climate Change and the United Nations Environment Programme (UN Environment).



OBJECTIVES

RCC Dubai will support the efforts of LAKI in the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) and North African sub regions by:

1. Identifying and engaging with relevant institutions and experts to support the organization and implementation of activities that will narrow prioritized adaptation knowledge gaps.

2. Disseminating knowledge outputs to intended knowledge users in the subregion as well as other relevant subregions, to support regional, national and subnational adaptation planning and implementation.
